

# Five musts in Milan.

The Milan Furniture Fair is considered by many to be the world's biggest design event. Offering an exhibition area of 145,000 sqm as well as exhibitions sprinkled throughout the centre of Milan, some tips could be very helpful. Here are Five Musts in Milan, if you were to ask us at Materia.

#### Salone Internazionale del Mobile (Milan Furniture Fair)

This year there will be 1,400 exhibitors in Milan from 14-19 April. It is well worth taking some time to investigate what is being shown in the different exhibition halls beforehand, so you can select what interests you most - it is impossible to see it all. The fair's official website is <u>www.salonemilano.it</u> and this is where you will find all of the information about where, when and how you will see different exhibitors. We highly recommend, regardless of your plans, that you set aside an hour or so for Salone Satellit, where young, unestablished designers display their exciting ideas. If you leave the exhibition area and head into Milan's buzzing city centre, definitely stop by Zona Tortona and its temporary

exhibitions.

In these old cultural and blue-collar neighbourhoods you will find antique shops alongside designer boutiques, but this area of the city also offers Milan's most enjoyable nightlife. Here in Brera is also where you will find Materia. We are located at Largo Treves 5 on Via Solferino. The building that houses Triennale was built in 1933 and is located at the edge


### of the Sempione Park. The museum is more like an inspirational centre for
